## Wild Onions and Scrambled Eggs- Pawnee Nation

Recipe cost: $\$ \mathbf{3 . 0 4}$ or $\mathbf{7 6 \$}$ per serving Wild Onions and Makes 4 servings, $1 / 2$ cup each Scrambled Eggs

You will need:
1 cup Wild onions
1 teaspoon Vegetable oil
2 tablespoons Water
6 Eggs
To taste Black pepper (optional)
What to do:

1. Clean and coarsely chop wild onions.
2. Add oil, water and onions to pan. Cover and cook until tender.
3. While onions are cooking, in a mixing bowl, add eggs and beat until smooth.
4. Add eggs to pan and scramble with onions until desired doneness.
5. Add black pepper, if using. Serve warm.
